Gregg is president of Superior Solutions, an IT security consulting and training firm.

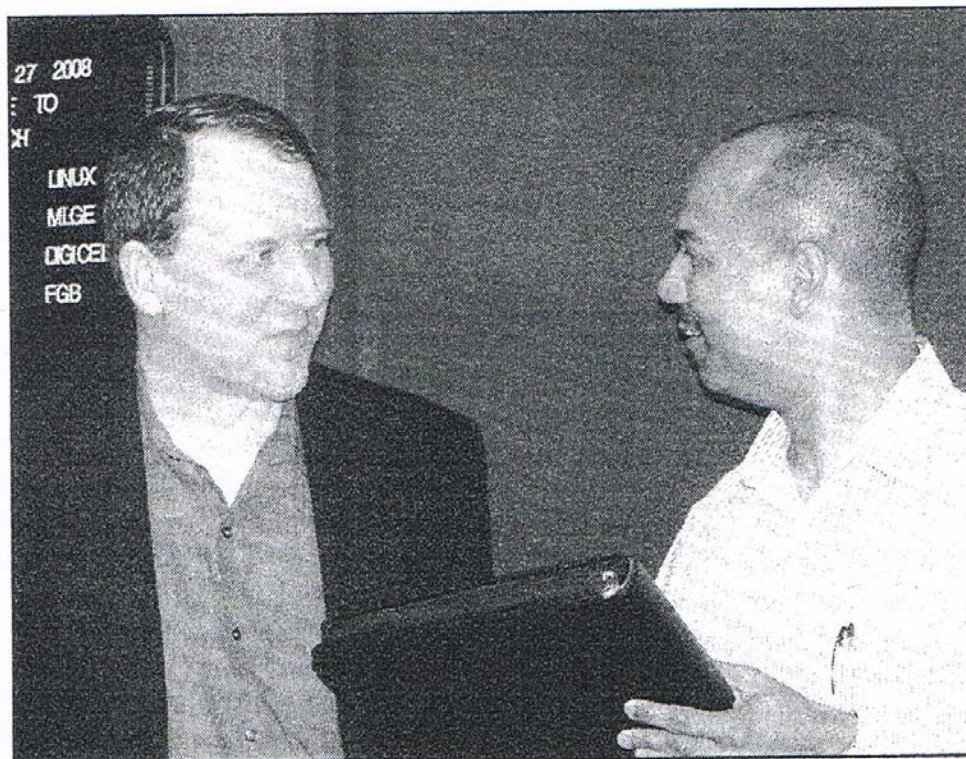
He holds several degrees, has over 20 IT certifications and has authored and co-authored 13 books.
